TRAINING GROUND

At university in Belgium, I studied Economics. At age 45, I decided to take lessons in ceramics at the Institute for Arts and Craft in Mechelen, my hometown, and earned my diploma at 50.

CREATIVE PROCESS

I'm inspired by mathematics with its infinite possibilities. I start by making a perfect geometrical shape with thin slabs of clay—either a hemisphere or an oval form—then I cut pieces with my big scissors to fold and create a new, attractive object.

ONE COOL FACT

The objects from my "Earthenware Ferrari" series are not glazed, but professionally sprayed with Ferrari red automotive paint in a body shop.
